

The Michigan Safety Conference is a volunteer organization dedicated to promoting the improvement of workplace safety and health practices in the State of Michigan. It provides participants with quality safety, health and environmental education through an annual conference that attracts one of the highest attendance ratings in the nation.

Prior to the Great Depression, the Michigan Safety Conference was formed to help Michigan business and industry reduce incidents, fatalities, and property damage. The first Safety Conference was held in 1929. Seven years later, in 1936, the second conference was held. Conference historical records reveal that the featured speaker was Gerald R. Ford, Sr., father of President Gerald R. Ford, Jr.

The annual conference was named the Michigan StateWide Safety Conference prior to World War II and continued to conduct a yearly event. By 1950, the organization was named the Michigan Safety Conference. Each year an annual conference was held, alternating between the cities of Detroit and Grand Rapids. In 1960, the conference was moved to Lansing where it was held each year until 2007. The conference now rotates between Lansing, Grand Rapids, and Novi.

The Michigan Safety Conference is governed by a Board of Directors and a General Committee. Membership in the organization is on a voluntary basis and includes representation from business, industry, academia, labor and government.
