## Why Home Safety Is Important

This has aptly been called an "all-out" war.

It might with equal justice be called an "all-in" war, because all of us are in it, and will be inescapably until victory is ours.

Now more than ever before each of us is important to the nation; each of us must stay able-bodied to produce for Victory. This is one of the added duties war has brought.

Many of us failed that duty last year. In our own homes, 30,500 were killed; 120,000 were permanently injured. More than four million others incurred lesser injuries.

Let's ask ourselves: Am I doing my duty to the men sweating in the South Seas area, the African desert, or muffled against the bitter Aleutian wind, if I let myself or one of my family be needlessly hurt at home? Am I doing my share if one of my family or myself interrupts war production by having an accident? Even if that member is not a worker, have I the right further to overtax medical facilities for the treatment of injuries needlessly incurred?

Most home accidents can be prevented. For this reason, common sense precautions are vitally important. They require little time, effort or expense; keeping toys from under foot, for example, or anchoring stair carpeting securely, will help prevent serious or fatal accidents. Such precautions will help save manpower for warpower.



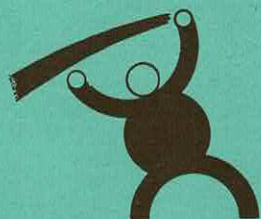
